

## **Terms and Conditions of the Young Scholars Excellence Award (2010)**

The Society for Multi-Ethnic Studies: Europe and the Americas (MESEA) has created the Young Scholars Excellence Award, which consists of two (2) research awards to be given to outstanding papers presented by graduate students and/or junior faculty members at the MESEA Conferences. Each Award will consist of a 500 euro prize and a certificate attesting to the Award.

### Requirements and Procedure for the Award:

1. The persons who solicit the Award must be registered members of MESEA when they submit their papers for consideration. They must submit proof of their status as graduate students or junior faculty (defined as persons who defended their dissertations less than 2 years before the date of the conference).
2. The participants must have previously submitted and received acceptance of their abstract. The full-length publishable completed article (5000-6000 words with no references to the author) must be **submitted online** at:

**Deadline: April 15, 2010 (midnight Central European Time)**
3. The Awardees will be informed of the Board of Judges' decision one month before the conference begins. Final awarding is contingent on the winners' attendance of the conference, where s/he is expected to deliver a shorter version of the paper in person.
4. The Awardees agree to submit the full essay for publication in a conference volume.

### Judging:

1. The Executive and Advisory Boards of MESEA will designate a 3-person Board of Judges for the Award, at least one of whom must be part of either MESEA Board. The names of the Board of Judges will be announced at the Awarding Ceremony.
2. The Awards will be given attending to excellence in scholarship, contribution to knowledge, clear and concise development of the thesis in connection with the conference theme.
3. One or both of the awards may not be given, if the judges deem the quality of the submissions not worthy of the award. The Judges' decision is final.
